Mr. Cronise presented a memorial from Dr. A. A. Biggs and thirty-six others, in favor of compensation for property destroyed by the Union and Rebel armies;

Which was read and referred to the Washington county delegation.

Mr. Watkins presented a memorial from the citizens of Montgomery county in favor of compensation for property destroyed by the Union and Rebel armies;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Angel submitted the following:

Ordered, that the Speaker instruct the Hall-keeper to ventilate this Hall each day of the Session, by lowering the windows, believing it to be conducive to the good health of the members;
