A bill entitled, an Act to repeal section 358 of Article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws of the city of Baltimore, relating to the inspection and guaging of domestic distilled liquors in said city, be and the same is hereby repealed, and the following enacted in lieu thereof:

A bill entitled, an Act for the inspection and guaging of Petroleum or Coal Oil in the city of Baltimore;

A bill entitled, an Act to amend section eight of Article fifty-four of the Code of Public General Laws relating to the Land Office;

A bill entitled, an Act to add to Article twenty-eight of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled County Commissioners, the following sections providing for the repair of public buildings necessary for county purposes and for the sale or other disposition of the property belonging to the county;

A bill entitled, an Act to add to article twenty-eight of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, County Commissioners, the following sections providing for the formation of election districts, and changing, locating and defining the boundaries of election districts, and for designating the place of voting therein;

Which were read the first time.
