Mr. Hoffman, from a Select committee, reported favorably a Senate bill entitled, an Act to repeal section 146 of the 3d Article of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the office of the Register of Wills for Baltimore county, and to reenact the same with amendments ;

The House took up for consideration the resolutions requesting the Executive to release all persons now suffering incarceration in the Penitentiary for enticing slaves to run away.
