The House resumed the consideration of the bill amending the laws in relation to the inspection of salted fish in Baltimore city;

The House took up the bill entitled, an Act to incorporate the Corn and Flour Exchange of the city of Baltimore,

Which was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, an Act to enable the Directors of the Maryland Institution for the Instruction of the Blind, to erect suitable buildings and to repeal section 5 of Article 33, of the Code of Public General Laws entitled, Indigent Blind and re-enact the same with amendments,

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, an Act to amend and re-enact the sixth section of the fifth Article of the Code of Public General Laws, and the twentieth section of the forty-eighth Article of said Code relating to appeals in cases of insolvency,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, an Act to amend section 280 of Article 93 of the Code of Public General Laws entitled, Testamentary Law relating to the sale of real estate by executors,
