

Thompson, for payment for certain services and recommended that it be referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

The report was accepted.

Also, reported back the memorial praying that an appropriation of a sufficient sum of money to enable to pay the men of the 7th, 9th and 4th regiments, (or their heirs,) U. S. Colored Troops, the same amount of State bounty that has been paid to the men of the 19th, 13th and 39th regiments, U. S. Colored Troops,

And recommended that the subject be referred to the committee on Ways and Means.

The report was accepted.

Mr. Anderson, from the committee on the Judiciary, reported favorably the following bills:

An Act to amend and re-enact sections 62 of Article 88, of the Code of Public General Laws entitled, "Sheriffs."

An Act to amend the 10th section of Article 5 of the Code of Public General Laws relating to appeals.

An Act to extend the time for the collection of officers fees;

Which were read the first time.

Also, reported unfavorably on the petition of Thomas M. Brown, for a law to remedy a defective deed.

The report was accepted.

Mr. Slothower, from the committee on Ways and Means, reported with amendments the Senate bill entitled, an Act to amend the first and second sections of the Act passed February eighth, eighteen hundred and sixty-five, at the pre ent session of the General Assembly entitled, an Act to provide bounty for soldiers entering the service of the United States, to fill the quotas of Maryland under the call of the President of the United States, of December 1864, and under future calls;

Which was read the second time.

Mr. Slothower, from the committee on Corporations, reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act to incorporate the Pocohontas Manufacturing company;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Slothower, from a select committee, reported favorably a bill entitled, an Act prohibiting the sale of spirituous or fermented liquors within one mile of Powhattan Factory, in Baltimore county.
