

Leave was granted the committee on Roads and Highways to report a bill relating to roads and highways and Road Supervisors.

Leave was granted the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill, to amend the eighty third Article of the Code of Public General Laws, adding thereto a section in regard to the liability of purchasers for the due application of the purchase money.

Leave was granted the Committee on Inspections to introduce a bill for the inspection of Coal Oil.

On motion of Mr. Rider,

Leave was granted the Committee on the Judiciary to report a bill, by which lunatic or insane persons confined in the Penitentiary, may be transferred to some Asylum better suited to their condition.

On motion of Mr. Tull,

Leave was granted the Committee on Claims to introduce a bill entitled, An Act to appropriate a sum of money to pay the Electors of President and Vice President of the United States in and for the State of Maryland, their officers and attendants.

On motion of Mr. Soper,

Leave was granted the Committee on Ways and Means to report a bill entitled, An Act to Amend An Act entitled, "An Act to aid and encourage enlistments into the Maryland Regiments, in the service of the United States," passed 1864, ch. 15, and to provide for the payment of the State bounty provided in said act to certain persons herein enumerated.

On motion of Mr. Hynes,

Leave was granted the Committee on Corporations to report a bill to Incorporate the German Fire Insurance Company of Baltimore.

Mr. McCauley from the Committee on Education, reported favorably the Senate bill entitled, An Act to locate the office of the State Superintendent of Public Instruction, in the city of Baltimore, and to furnish the same.
