A bill entitled, an Act to amend the 32d section of the 17th Article of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the election of Commissioners for the town of Centreville, in Queen Anne's county;

Which was read the first time and referred to the Queen Anne's county delegation;

House bill entitled, an Act appropriating a sum of money to pay Job Evans and Son, for altering and fitting up five committee rooms in the State House;

Endorsed "passed by yeas and nays."

Ordered, That 200 extra copies of the bill for the registration of voters be printed for the use of this House.
