On motion of Mr. Chew,

Leave was granted the committee on the Judiciary to introduce an Act providing special terms of the Circuit Courts for the counties for the trial of criminal and other cases.

Also, leave was granted the committee on the Judiciary, to report a bill relating to Bills of Exchange and Promissory Notes.

On motion of Mr. Showacre,

Leave was granted the committee on Ways and Means to introduce a bill for the extension of Mary Poteet's time in the Maryland Institution for the Instruction of the Blind.

On motion of Mr. Hynes,

Leave was granted the Baltimore city delegation to report a bill to amend sections 10, 11, and 15, of Article 84, of the Code of Public General Laws relating to schools.

On motion of Mr. Pennington,
