

Manufacturing Company, and to enable the stockholders and their legal representatives to transfer and convey the real estate and other property now or formally belonging to said corporation.

On motion of Mr. Soper,

Leave was granted the committee on Ways and Means to introduce a bill for an appropriation to the State Industrial School for Girls.

Also, leave was granted the committee on Ways and Means to introduce a bill to repeal an Act passed March 8th, 1862, entitled, an Act for the relief of the families of the Maryland volunteers and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Also, leave was granted the committee on Ways and Means to introduce a bill to amend an Act passed January session, 1864, chapter 137, entitled an Act to amend and re-enact section 25, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, Fees of officers and relating to the fees of Notaries Public.

On motion of Mr. Anderson,

Leave was granted the committee on Corporations to introduce a bill to amend the charter of the Hagerstown and Smithburg Turnpike Company in Washington county.

On motion of Mr. Tolson,

Leave was granted the Queen Anne's county delegation to amend and re-enact section one hundred and fifty-seven, of Article seventeen, of the Supplementary Code, vol. 2nd, entitled, Queen Anne's county, relating to weights and measures.

Mr. Anderson, from the Committee on the Judiciary, reported back to the House with amendment the bill entitled, an Act to authorize the county Commissioners of Anne Arundel county to allow the sheriff of said county additional compensation for boarding prisoners;

Which was taken up for consideration upon its third reading.

Mr. Anderson submitted the following amendment:

Amend by striking out all after the word "county," in line 4 of section one and insert "such additional sum per day as compensation for the board of prisoners, committed to the Jail of said county from the sixteenth day of March, eighteen hundred and sixty-four to the first day of November, eighteen hundred and sixty-four, as in their judgment they may deem advisable.

Which was decided in the affirmative.
