The Secretary of the Senate delivered the following bills :

Senate bill entitled, an Act to prohibit the granting of license for the sale of spirituous or fermented liquor, or lager beer, at or near Federalsburg, in Dorchester and Caroline counties, in the State of Maryland;

Which was read the first time and referred to the Caroline and Dorchester county delegations.

An Act entitled, an Act to amend and continue in force an Act entitled, an Act to incorporate the North Branch Company, passed at the session of this General Assembly, began and held on the 5th day of January, 1853, chapter 108;

Endorsed "passed by yeas and nays."

An Act appropriating a sum of money to pay the claims of James S. Crawford, George Jacobi, Wm. Evans and Whitney, Cushing & Co.;

Endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays."

A bill entitled, an Act to amend the fifth and sixth sections of the fifty-sixth Article of the Code of Public General Laws relating to the licensing of billiard tables;

Endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays with proposed amendment."

On motion of Mr. Anderson, the said bill was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary.

A bill entitled, an Act to amend and re-enact section 811 and 812, of the 4th article of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, in relation to the pay of the Police of Baltimore city;

Endorsed, "passed by yeas and nays with proposed amendments."
