The said bill was then returned to the Senate.

The bill entitled, an Act to add to the Code of Public General Laws an Article under the title of militia and to provide for the organization and discipline of the military forces of the State,

The bill entitled, an Act to amend an Act entitled, an Act to aid and encourage enlistments into the Maryland regiments in the service of the United States, passed 1864, chapter 15, and to provide for the prompt payment of the bounties therein specified, and to repeal section 4, of said Act and to reenact the same so as to make the bounties therein specified payable to the widows and heirs of deceased soldiers,
