

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

On motion of Mr. Soper,

Leave was granted the committee of Ways and Means to introduce a bill entitled, an Act to provide for terminating the relation of creditor and debtor between the State and the Susquehanna and Tide Water Canal Companies.

Mr. Anderson, from the Committee on the Judiciary, reported back to the House, with the Senate amendments, the bill entitled, an Act to amend the Local Laws of Baltimore city, relating to the drawing of jurors.

AMENDMENTS PROPOSED :

Amend section 1st by striking out from the 24th line thereof, the words "clerk, or in the presence," and inserting in lieu thereof, the words "clerks and;"

Amend section 1st by striking out from the 27th, 28th and 29th lines, the words, "shall be duly recorded by the said clerk, or such of the deputies as the court shall appoint in the order in which they are drawn," and inserting in their stead the words, "shall be duly recorded in the order in which they shall be drawn by the said clerks, or under their personal direction and inspection by some person to be appointed by the judges aforesaid;"

Amend by striking out the whole of the second section;
