Mr. Anderson, from the Committee on the Judiciary, reported favorably bill entitled, an Act to add a new section to Article 28 of the Code of Public General Laws relating to County Commissioners, authorizing them to levy money to pay for re-binding, indexing and transcribing books and dockets in the office of the register of wills and clerks of the circuit courts;

Which was read the first time and re-committed to the Committee on the Judiciary;

The bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 1 and 2 of Article 87 of the Code of Public General Laws relating to sheep and dogs, and enact the following sections in lieu thereof,

Was read the third time and passed by yeas and nays as follow :
