

Mr. Poteet, from the committee on Claims, reported favorably the Senate bill entitled, an Act to regulate the mileage of the members and officers of the General Assembly, and providing for the payment of the same;

Which was read the second time.

Mr. Wardwell moved that the rules be suspended in order to place the bill upon its third reading;

Which was decided in the negative.

Mr. Valliant submitted the following resolution:

JOINT RESOLUTION

To empower the State Librarian to furnish to the several Justices of the Peace of the State the first and second volumes of the supplement to the Code.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Librarian be and he is hereby authorized and directed to furnish to the several Justices of the Peace of the State the first and second volumes of the supplemental Code, and for that purpose is hereby authorized to purchase as soon as practicable and at publishers price, seventy-five volumes of the first volume of the supplemental Code and four hundred and seventy-five volumes of the second volume of the supplement. Provided the volumes hereby authorized to be furnished to said Justices shall be handed over by them to the Clerks of the Circuit Courts of the several counties or to the Clerk of the Superior Court of Baltimore city at the expiration of the times for which they may have been elected or appointed, or in case of their resignation, or removal from office, on their removal or resignation.

Which was read the first time.

The bill entitled, an Act to regulate and make uniform the compensation of the Judges of the Orphans' Courts of the several counties and the city of Baltimore,

Was taken up for consideration on its second reading.

Mr. Darling submitted the following amendment:

Section 2, strike out in line 5, all after counties to each, in line 6 and insert in line 6, after dollars "and the Judges of the Orphans' Court of Baltimore city shall receive six dollars;"

Mr. Rider submitted the following amendment to the amendment:

Amend the amendment by inserting "the Judges of the Orphans' Court of several counties and the city of Baltimore, shall each receive the sum of five dollars;
