PROPOSED AMENDMENTS.

Strike out "November" and insert "April," in section 1, line 5.

Insert in line 6, after the word "State," "prior to the 1st day of April, 1864."

Strike out all after "mother," in line 11, section 4, and insert, "and if he leave no mother then the same shall revert to the State."

On motion of Mr. Tull,

The House concurred in the first and second amendments and non-concurred in the third amendment.

Mr. Tull submitted the following message to the Senate:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES,

March 16th, 1865.

*Gentlemen of the Senate:*

We have concurred in your first and second amendments to House Bill, No. 60, entitled, an Act to amend an Act entitled, "an Act to aid and encourage enlistments into the Maryland Regiments in the service of the United States, &c.," the first striking out "November," and inserting "April," in section I, line 5, and the 2nd, by inserting in line 6, after the word "State," of said section, "prior to the 1st day of April, 1864," but have non-concurred in your 3d amendment, which strikes out all after "mother," in 11th line of section 4, and inserts "and if he leave no mother, then the same shall revert to the State," and respectfully request you to recede therefrom.
