It was decided in the negative.

The bill entitled, an Act to add an additional section to Article 5 of the Code of Public General Laws, in relation to appeals,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, an an Act to amend Article 11, of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled Frederick county,

Was taken up for consideration on its second reading.

On motion of Mr. Buhrman,

The said bill was re-committed to the Frederick county delegation.

The bill entitled, an Act to refund to James Worden, executor of James George, deceased, certain taxes erroneously paid, J. W. Quinn's heirs or representatives and certain money paid for license on commission as Inspector and Corder of wood, in the city of Baltimore,

Was taken up for consideration, on its second reading.

Mr. Pilkington submitted the following amendment:

Amend by inserting after "Baltimore," in line 9, Charles A. S. Wolf, twenty-two dollars for repairing clocks in State House;

Which was decided in the affirmative.

Mr. Miller, of Anne Arundel, submitted the following amendment:

In section 1, after the word "Howard," in line 7, insert "upon the recommendation of the Comptroller and Treasurer," and also upon the same recommendation;

Which was decided in the affirmative.

The bill having been read the second time was ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
