And be it enacted, That section fourteen, of Article ninety-three of the Code of Public General Laws, be and is hereby amended, by adding the following, viz : Nevertheless, whenever any person dying, leaving in this State property subject to administration, the said letters of administration shall be granted in the county wherein was the mansion house or residence of the deceased, provided he had such, lying in said county.
