In section 6, line 2, strike out the words “bound in fine law calf;”

In section 6, line 3, strike out “six” and insert “five;”

In section 7, at the end add “and shall remain in force until the first Monday of April, eighteen hundred and sixty-seven;”

In section 5, line 7, strike out “five” and insert “six” and in line 8, strike out “four” and insert “five;”
