hundred and eighty, of Article thirty, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled, Crimes and Punishments,

Was taken up for consideration on its second reading.

Mr. Rider submitted the following amendment:

In section 1, line 10, between "alley and" insert "nor shall any barber or barbers engage in the business of shaving, shampooning or hair-dressing on the Sabbath;

Which was decided in the negative.

The bill having been read the second time was ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, an Act to authorize Southey F. Miles, of Somerset county, to erect gates on the county road in said county,

Was taken up for consideration on its third reading.

Mr. Smith, of Frederick, moved that said bill be laid over informally;

Which was decided in the negative.

Mr. Buhrman moved that the bill be re-committed to the Somerset county delegation;

Which was decided in the negative.

The bill having been read the second time was ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, an Act to amend section 20, Article 4, Public Local Laws of Baltimore city, and to re-enact the same with amendments,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled, an Act to repeal an Act passed March 10th, 1864, entitled, an Act to purchase and enclose a part of the battle-field at Antietam for the purpose of a State and National Cemetery, chapter 237, Acts of 1864, and to incorporate the Antietam National Cemetery in Washington county,

Was taken up for consideration on its second reading.

Mr. Cronise submitted the following amendment:

Section 12, line one, strike out the words "that when completed;"

Which was decided in the affirmative.

The bill having been read the second time was ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
