The rules were suspended and the House proceeded to the consideration of bills on their third reading.

The bill entitled, an Act to appropriate a sum of money sufficient to procure a full length portrait of the late Governor Thomas Holliday Hicks, to be placed in the Executive Chamber of Maryland, and a further sum to erect a monument over the remains, whenever they may be finally interred;
