The House reconsidered the vote by which the bill entitled, an Act to authorize and direct the State's Attorneys of Baltimore and Harford counties, to institute proceedings to forfeit the charter of the Baltimore and Harford Turnpike Company; also, to authorize and direct the State's Attorney of Baltimore county to institute like proceedings to forfeit the charter of the president, managers and company of the Baltimore and Yorktown Turnpike Road; and like proceedings against the president, managers and company of the Baltimore and Fredericktown Turnpike Road, by the State's Attorneys of Baltimore, Howard, Frederick and Washington counties,

Was rejected for want of a constitutional majority.

The bill was then passed by yeas and nays as follow:

The Senate bill entitled, an Act to amend the act passed on the 10th day of March, 1862, chapter 251, conferring certain powers on the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, in relation to levying and collecting taxes for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the municipal government, so as more clearly to exempt certain property from taxation for such purposes,
