## AMENDMENTS PROPOSED:

Amend House bill entitled, an Act to regulate and make uniform the fees of Justices of the Peace, by striking out all after section 1st and inserting the following:

Section 2. And be it further enacted, That sections seventeen, eighteen and nineteen, of Article thirty-eight of the Code of Public General laws relating to the fees of Justices of the Peace be repealed, and the following sections be adopted in lieu thereof:

17. The Justices of the Peace of this State shall be entitled to receive the fees allowed in the following table and such fees shall be taxed and paid by the party against whom judgment shall be rendered to wit:
