ble substance, has been introduced into such Petroleum or Coal Oil, the Inspector and Guager shall brand the cask or package containing the same, with the word "condemned;" and if such Petroleum or Coal Oil shall be found to contain no such inflammable substance, the said Inspector and Guager shall brand the cask or package, with the word "Pure;" and on all casks or packages, whether the contents thereof be condemned or not, the Inspector shall, with a stencil, mark his name and the date of inspection;

Which was decided in the negative.

Mr. King submitted the following amendment:

Section 2, line 9, after the word "than" strike out "twenty-five dollars" and insert "fifteen;"

Which was decided in the affirmative.

Mr. Kirk submitted the following amendment:

Section 4. And be it enacted, That each of said Inspectors shall, on the 15th day of January and the 15th day of July, in each and every year, return to the Treasurer of the State, under oath, a statement of his receipts, and should the proceeds of his or their office be more than eighteen hundred dollars, then the amount over and above the said eighteen hundred dollars dollars hall be paid to the Treasurer of the State for the use of the State;

The bill was re-committed to the committee on Inspections. Mr. Pilkington, from Select committee, reported back to the House, with amendments, the bill entitled, an act relating to the Registration of the voters of the State;

Which was taken up for consideration on its second reading. Mr. Williams submitted the following amendment:

Amend section first, by inserting after the word "shall" in the 5th line, the words "who shall be residents of the election district or ward of the city of Baltimore, for which they were respectively appointed;
