A bill entitled, an Act to Incorporate the Chesapeake and Potomac Canal Company;

A bill entitled, an Act to make valid all deeds acknowledged without this State before a Justice of the Peace of any other State, in which said acknowledgment was made;

A bill entitled, an Act to amend and re-enact the 16th Article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to the pay of Jurors, and to repeal all Local Laws on the subject of the pay of Jurors;

The bill entitled, an Act to repeal section 358 of Article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws of the city of Baltimore, relating to the inspection and guaging of domestic distilled liquors in said city, be and the same is hereby repealed, and the following enacted in lieu thereof:
