

sell or offer for sale any Petroleum or Coal Oil which has been condemned by the Inspector, shall upon conviction thereof, be fined in a sum not less than fifty dollars, nor more than five hundred dollars; and should any person use, or attempt to use any cask or vessel, after such cask or vessel has been emptied, without obliterating the Inspector's mark or brand, such person shall, on conviction thereof, forfeit the sum of ten dollars for every vessel or cask, and cost of prosecution; said fine to be paid to the informer;

Pending the consideration of which,

Mr. Pilkington moved that the bill be indefinitely postponed.

Mr. Pilkington moved that the bill be laid over informally, and be printed as amended;

Decided in the affirmative.

The bill entitled, an Act to amend and re-enact section 62, of Article 88 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled Sheriffs;
