End of section 3 insert, "provided that the existing laws of the State providing for taxes on the State Banks for the purposes enumerated therein, shall extend and apply to all State Banks and other institutions availing themselves of the provisions of this Act when they shall have become banking associations under the Act of Congress, and all sums required by the charters of said institutions and banks to be paid to the State shall continue as heretofore to be paid;"
