Mr. Soper, from the committee on Ways and Means, reported with amendments,

The bill entitled, an Act supplementary to an Act, entitled, an Act making appropriations for the support of the Government, for the year ending on the first day of January, 1866;

Add to section one:

"To the Pennsylvania Institution for the Deaf and Dumb, for losses incurred in the education of the beneficiaries of this State during the years eighteen hundred and sixty-three and eighteen hundred and sixty-four, five hundred and ninety-one dollars and seventy-five cents;

For the expense of fitting up the room adjoining the Court of Appeals, for the preservation of Records, twenty-five hundred dollars, to be expended under the order of the Judges of the Court of Appeals;

For the salary of a Clerk to the Adjutant General of Militia, one thousand dollars;
