Said bill was then sent to the Senate.

Mr. McCauley, from the committee on the Judiciary, reported with amendments the bill entitled, an Act to provide a simple and uniform system of charges in the office of clerks of courts in the several counties of the State and the city of Baltimore;

Which was taken up for consideration on its second reading.

Mr. McCauley submitted the following amendment:

Section 1st, line 22, strike out "five" and insert "ten;" line 46, strike out "fifty" and insert seventy-five;" line 49, after the word "recognizance" insert "twenty-five." At the end of 1st section, insert for every release issued "twenty-five cents," for every forfeited recognizance "twenty-five cents;"

Which was decided in the affirmative.

The bill having been read the second time was ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Also, reported with amendments the bill entitled, an Act to add a new section to Article 28, of the Code of Public General Laws relating to County Commissioners, authorizing them to levy money to pay for re-binding, indexing and transcribing books and dockets in the offices of the Register of Wills and Clerks of the Circuit courts;

Which was taken up consideration on its second reading.

Mr. McCauley submitted the following amendment:

AMENDMENTS PROPOSED BY THE COMMITTEE:

Strike out all after the enacting clause and insert the following: "Whenever any record books or dockets in the office of the Clerk of the Circuit court of any county or of any of the courts of Baltimore city, in the opinion of the Judges of any of the said courts need transcribing, rebinding or indexing, and whenever any such books or dockets in the office of any of the Registers of Wills of the State in the opinion of the Judges of the Orphans' court of any county or of the city of Baltimore need rebinding, transcribing or indexing, the Clerks of the said courts or the Register of Wills of the said
