

county or city, shall under the direction of the Judge of the said courts or Judges of the Orphans' courts aforesaid have the said books and dockets transcribed, rebound or indexed, and the County Commissioners or Mayor and City Council of Baltimore city shall levy a sufficient amount of tax to pay a reasonable sum for having such books and dockets transcribed, rebound and indexed;"

Which was decided in the affirmative.

The bill having been read the second time, was ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Norris, from a Select committee, reported favorably the bill entitled, an Act to incorporate the Baltimore and Liberty Turnpike Road Company in Carroll county;
