

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on Corporations.

A bill entitled, an Act to authorize the South Baltimore Company to hold lands to the amount of three thousand acres and to increase its capital;

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on Corporations.

A bill entitled, an Act to repeal the first twelve sections of Article 98 of the Code of Public General Laws relating to Wild Fowl, so far as they apply to Dorchester and Talbot counties;

Which was read the first time and referred to the Dorchester and Talbot county delegations.

A bill entitled, an Act to amend and re-enact the 16th section of the 50th Article of the Code of Public General Laws relating to the pay of Jurors, and to repeal all Local Laws on the subject of the pay of Jurors,

Endorsed "passed by yeas and nays."

A bill entitled, an Act to repeal Article 71 of the Code of Public General Laws entitled, "oysters" regulating the taking and catching of oysters within the waters of this State and to re-enact the same with amendments,

Endorsed "passed by yeas and nays with proposed amendments."

After the word "Sound" in line 19 of printed bill, insert the words "and not on any oyster bed or rock in or about Tally's Point, Sandy Point, Hackett's Point, Thomas' Point, the Three Sisters on the Western side of the Chesapeake Bay.

Strike out the 2d section.
