manuscript of the Report of the State Superintendent of Public Instruction to the General Assembly of Maryland, together with a bill, entitled, a Uniform System of Public Instruction for the State of Maryland, and that he be directed to file and preserve the same in his office.

On motion of Mr. Poteet,

Ordered, That the committee on Claims be instructed to issue certificates for such amount as is customary to the members or officers who are detained after the adjournment of the General Assembly, in closing up the business of the session.

Mr. McCauley submitted the following:

Ordered, That 3,000 copies in English and 500 in German of the School Law be printed for circulation in the State, to be distributed by the Chief Clerk of this House to the members as soon as printed;

Mr. Lusby from the committee on Agriculture, reported favorably the Senate bill entitled, an Act to prevent the sale or gift of spirituous, fermented or brewed liquors to minors connected with the Maryland Agricultural College;

Mr. Kirk, from the committee on Inspections, reported favorably the Senate bill entitled, an Act to amend and re-enact section 21, of Article 41, of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to Fish and Fisheries;

Which was read the second time.

Mr. Slothower, from the committee on Corporations, reported favorably the following Senate bills:

A bill entitled, an Act to provide for the transfer and conveyance of the property of the Elysville Manufacturing Company, a corporation created by the Act of 1828, chapter 32;

A bill entitled, an Act to authorize the South Baltimore Company to hold Lands to the amount of 3,000 acres, and to increase its capital;

A bill entitled, an Act to amend and re-enact section 21 of
