The bill entitled, an Act to appropriate a sum of money to pay certain members of the committee of Ways and Means of the House of Delegates and of the committee on Finance in the Senate of 1864, for labors performed and services rendered after the adjournment of the Legislature, in accordance with the requirements of joint resolution No. 11, assented to March 10th, 1864,

Was read the third time and rejected for want of a constitutional majority, by yeas and nays as follow:
