A bill entitled, an Act to release certain claims of the State against collectors, sheriffs and others, and to discontinue the suits instituted for the recovery thereof,

A bill entitled, an Act to appropriate a sum of money to pay the balance for repairing and refurnishing the court room and clerk's office of the Court of Appeals,
