Memorial from the Mayor and Council of, praying the passage of an act to legalize their official acts, they having failed to take the Constitutional oath within the time required, referred to committee on the Judiciary, 213; bill reported favorably and read the first time, 245; read second time, 258; considered and re-committed to Washington county delegation, 420; reported with an amendment, concurred in and bill passed by yeas and nays, 431; sent to the Senate, 432; returned from the Senate passed, 579.

Leave granted Washington county delegation, to report a bill to amend Article 21, of the Code of Public Local Laws of Washington county, empowering the Mayor and Council of, to open and repair sewers and water courses in said town, 395; bill reported favorably and read the first time, 413; read second time and referred to Washington county delegation, 650; reported with amendment, concurred in and bill read third time and passed by yeas and nays, 668; sent to the Senate, 668.

Memorial from the Mayor and Council of, praying the General Assembly to empower them to lease the Town Hall of said town, referred to Washington county delegation, 234.

Leave granted Washington county delegation, to report a bill as above, 236.
