each session, return a full report of its proceedings, authenticated by the signature of each member thereof, to the adjutant general, containing a statement of the names of all applicants for exemption, and of all exempted, with the causes of such exemption, and an account of all fees received.

Compensation.

SECT. 18.—The compensation of the district commandant shall be as hereinbefore provided. For his professional services as a member of the board, the examining surgeon shall receive a compensation of five dollars, and the third member of said board shall receive a compensation of four dollars for each day they may be respectively employed in attendance upon the same, to be paid out of the military fund.

Penalty for Offering or Receiving Bribe.

SECT. 19.—Any member of said board of exemption who shall, directly or indirectly, ask or receive any fee or gratuity other than that herein prescribed for considering or acting upon any claim for exemption; and any applicant for exemption who shall, directly or indirectly, offer any such fee or gratuity, shall be punished by a fine of not less than fifty nor more than five hundred dollars, and by imprisonment for not less than five nor more than twenty days, in the discretion of a court martial.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR 1864-5.

SECT. 20.—A copy of the enrollment hereinbefore referred to as recently made by order of the Governor shall be deposited by the adjutant general in the clerk's offices of the Circuit Courts of the several counties, and the Superior Court of Baltimore city, as hereinbefore provided for the enrollments generally, on or before the first day of December next, and said officer shall at the same time give notice thereof in the same manner and of the same purport, as provided in the 11th section, except that the enrolled men shall be therein warned for the year 1865, to join some volunteer company or pay commutation, as hereinafter provided, on or before the first day of March, in that year, and the same proceedings will be had after that day to collect said commutation, as hereinafter provided, and the said boards of exemption shall for that year assemble on the first Monday in January, 1865, instead of the first Monday in May, as herein directed for subsequent years. (V. Sect. 205.)

MILITARY FUND.

SECT. 21.—To provide the means of meeting the expenses necessarily incurred in the organization and discipline of the militia, a district military fund is hereby established in each of the several military districts, under the control of the respective district commandants, and a general military fund

made, or the draft ordered.
