regulations for the army of the United States, and to be issued in kind.

Sect. 197.—The said commissary general shall also, upon like requisition, furnish such arms, ordnance and ammunition as may be necessary for the use of such encampments or garrisons.

Absentees.

Sect. 198.—The same fine shall be assessed for each day of absence without leave from any camp or garrison, as is hereinbefore provided for absence from any parade, and within twenty days after each tour of camp or garrison duty, the said fines shall be heard and determined by the proper regimental, battalion or company courts of review, with the same notice, and to be followed by similar proceedings, as hereinbefore provided, in the case of parades by section 75, &c.

Expense of Camps, &c.

SECT. 199.—For all such sums as shall be required by the engineer and quartermaster of said camps, forts and stations, in laying out and preparing the ground designated for such purpose, and in furnishing quarters for said troops, also for all such sums as shall be required for the pay, transportation, subsistence and all necessary supplies for said troops, provision shall be made by the paymaster general, as hereinafter directed, out of the State military fund.

COMPENSATION FOR MILITARY SERVICE.

SECT. 200.—The military forces of this State, when in actual service of the State in time of war, insurrection, invasion or imminent danger thereof, shall during their time of service, be entitled to the same pay, rations and other allowances as are or may be hereafter established by law for the army of the United States, and whenever specially ordered to perform camp, garrison or guard duty shall be entitled to the same rate of compensation for every day actually employed in the performance of such duty.

Pay Roll of Non-Commissioned Officers and Privates.

SECT. 201.—The commanding officer of every company which shall have been ordered to perform camp or garrison duty, as aforesaid, and of every company or detachment which shall have performed a tour of guard duty under the orders of the commander-in-chief, either in attendance upon a court martial or otherwise, shall, immediately upon the expiration of each tour of duty, make out an alphabetical list of all the members of his company or detachment who shall have appeared and performed such duty, uniformed, armed and equipped, as hereinbefore provided, and shall set opposite to
