Of those received during the year, 46 are white males, 6 are white females, 29 are colored males, 17 are colored females. Total, 98.

Of them were convicted for the first time, 92; second, 5; fifth, 1. Total, 98.

The highest number in prison at any time during the year was 446; the lowest number 386, and the average number 413.

Of those pardoned, 24 were pardoned by Governor Bradford and 2 by President Lincoln. Total, 26.
