

Ordered, That the committee on Education inquire into the necessity or expediency of creating a School Fund of six millions, of dollars as required by the present Constitution, and whether it be not advisable for this General Assembly to propose an amendment thereto, by striking out section six of Article eight, entitled, "Education."

Mr. Carroll presented the petition of John Swann and others;
