*Gentlemen of the Senate :*

We propose with the concurrence of your Honorable Body, that the two Houses of the General Assembly proceed to Washington on the Fourth of March proximo, for the purpose of participating in the ceremonies attending the inauguration of Abraham Lincoln, as President of the United States.

We propose the appointment of a committee of five on the part of House and four on the part of the Senate, to make the necessary arrangements.

We have appointed Messrs. Willis, Buhrman, Mules, Lusby, and Smith, of Allegany, on the part of the House.

BY THE SENATE,

February 24th, 1865.
