

and be credited to the quota of the sub-district of the State where such volunteer, drafted man or man liable to service resides, the fact of his having so entered the service, and being so credited, to be first ascertained and certified as hereinafter directed.

2. And be it enacted, That three responsible citizens shall be appointed by the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Senate for each county, and for each of the Legislative districts of the city of Baltimore, to be called the Maryland State Bounty Boards for the said counties and city respectively, and that the said Boards upon giving bond with security to the amount of ten thousand dollars by each member of said Board, to be approved by the Governor, shall have the right to draw from time to time upon the Comptroller of the Treasury for such sums as shall be required to pay the bounty herein authorized to the men who are credited to the district within which said Bounty Boards are situated; the draft of said Bounty Boards to be affixed to a roll bearing upon it the names of the persons to whom said bounty is to be paid and of the sub-district at which they are credited as aforesaid, with a certificate thereon endorsed from the Assistant Provost Marshal General for the State, declaring that the men thereon enrolled have been so credited to the quota of said sub-district and with another certificate also thereto annexed from the Colonel or commanding officer of the regiment or other organization, or the commander of the ship or naval rendezvous, as the case may be, to which the men mentioned on said roll have been assigned, stating that they have been received at the camp of said regiment or other organization, or the ship or naval rendezvous aforesaid. The said roll so certified and with the draft of the Bounty Board thereon shall be retained by the Comptroller, and he upon its receipt shall issue the usual warrant to the Treasurer for the payment of the amount of said draft, &c.
