Leave was granted Messrs. Trail, Tome and Clarke, to report a bill to amend and re-enact the act passed at the session of 1862, chapter 251, conferring certain powers on the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, in relation to levying and collecting taxes.

Mr. Maund, from the committee on Judicial Proceedings, to which was referred the bill relating to conveyencing,

Reported it with the following amendment:

Amend the first section by striking out all of said section after the word "deed," in the seventeenth line thereof;

Which was read and adopted, and

The bill was read the second time.

Mr. Maund, from the committee on Judicial Proceedings, reported a bill relating to fees of officers;

Which was read the first time, and

Ordered to be printed.

Mr. Carroll, from the committee on Corporations, reported a bill supplementary to an Act incorporating the Superanuated Fund Society;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Carroll, from the committee on Corporations, to which was referred the bill incorporating the Locust Point company of the city of Baltimore,

Reported it with the following amendments:

Amend section 3, line 20, by inserting after the word "otherwise," the words "not exceeding one-half the amount of their cash capital paid in;"

At the end of section 5, add "except for the services of laborers employed in and about their works;"

Add to end of section 9th, "and the General Assembly hereby reserves to itself the right to alter amend or repeal this Act at pleasure;"

Which were read and adopted, and

The bill was read the second time.

Mr. Tome, from the committee on Finance, to which was referred the bills in favor of Thomas Donaldson and Job Evans;

Reported them without amendment, and

They were severally read the second time.
