Sir, I do not propose the vain attempt of pronouncing a suitable eulogium on Washington, the soul, the genius of that painting; all I desire is that it should speak more fully for itself, and that every pilgrim as he comes up hither to gaze on the alter of liberty or its emblem, and to worship at its shrine, may first listen in imagination to his oracles of wisdom and then read his own words;"

Which was read and referred to the committee on Finance.
