

Said bill was then returned to the House of Delegates.

The bill amending the Local Law relating to the Police of Baltimore,

Was read the third time;

Mr. Maund submitted the following amendments :

Amend by adding the following section :

“Section 3. And be it enacted, That the pay herein provided for the policemen, detective policemen and officers of police aforesaid, shall continue only until the first day of April, 1867, and that from and after said day the pay of said policemen, detective policemen and officers of police shall be the same as now provided by law.”

Amend by striking out the word and figure “section 3,” in the first line of section 3, and inserting in lieu thereof the word and figure “section 4 ;”

Which was read and adopted, and
