Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on Elections.

Mr. Billingslea, of Carroll, reported a bill relating to the Commissioners of Carroll county holding real estate for the safety of the school fund;

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on Judicial Proceedings.

Mr. Ohr, from the committee on Internal Improvements, to which was referred the bill incorporating the Baltimore and Herring Run Passenger Railway company,

Reported it with the following amendments:

Amend section eight, line forty-eight, by inserting after the word "shall," the word "not;" in line forty-nine, strike out all from the word "but to damages," both inclusive;"

Which were read and adopted, and

The bill was read the second time.
