Mr. Maund, from the committee on Judicial Proceedings, reported a bill amending the Local Laws relating to the Frederick county court;

Mr. Tome, from the committee on Finance, reported a bill amending the General Laws relating to revenue and taxes;

Which was read the first time, and

Ordered to be printed.

Also, from the same committee, reported a bill amending the Code relating to taxation upon the property of Literary and Charitable Institutions;

Which was read the first time, and

Ordered to be printed.

Mr. Tome, from the committee on Finance, submitted the following

REPORT:

To the Honorable,

The General Assembly of Maryland:

The committee of Ways and Means of the House of Delegates, and the committee of Finance in the Senate of the session of 1864, respectfully report that under the provisions of the Joint Resolution of March 10th, 1864, No. 11, they went to the city of Annapolis, on second day of May, A. D., 1864, and at the office of the Treasurer of Maryland, proceeded to examine, count and burn the bonds and certificates for stocks of the State purchased or obtained by the Treasurer, and that the said bonds and certificates for stock so examined, counted and bound were as followers: one hundred and thirty-two thousand two hundred and forty-one dollars and forty-eight cents of stocks of the State of Maryland purchased for and in augmentation of the sinking fund from 30th of September, 1861, to 31st of December, 1861, by Sprigg Harwood, the late Treasurer of the State, (\$132,241.48;) and four hundred and seventy-five thousand five hundred and eighty-seven dollars and seventeen cents, (\$475,587.17,) purchased for and in augmentation of the sinking fund from February 3rd, 1862,
