Mr. Maund, from the committee on the Judiciary reported the following bills:

A bill amending the General Laws relating to crimes and punishments;

A bill adding to the General Law relating to crimes and punishments;

Which were read the first time, and

Ordered to be printed.

A bill relating to deeds of manumission;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Clark, from the committee on the Judiciary, to which was referred the bill making uniform the fees of Constables,

Reported it with the following amendments:

Amend House bill entitled, an Act to regulate and make uniform the fees of Constables, by striking out in section 2d, line 7, the words "fifty cents" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "seventy-five cents."

By striking out in section 2d, line 8, the words "fifty cents" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "seventy-five cents."

By striking out in section 2d, line 9, the words "fifty cents" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "forty-five cents."

By striking out in section 2d line 12, the words "fifteen
