Which was read the first time, and referred to committee on Judicial Proceedings.

A bill entitled, an Act to repeal the Act of 1864, ch. 138, to provide for the restoration of the records and papers in the office of the Circuit Court for Baltimore county;

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on Judicial Proceedings.
