The clerk of the House of Delegates returned the following bills :

A bill entitled an act to appropriate a sum of money to the Home of the Friendless;

A bill entitled, an Act to amend the Act passed on the 10th day of March, 1862, chapter 251, conferring certain powers on the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, in relation to levying and collecting taxes for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Municipal government so as more clearly to exempt certain property from taxation for such purposes;

A bill entitled, an Act to provide for the completion of the restoration of the records and papers destroyed or injured by fire, in the office of the clerk of the Circuit Court for Baltimore county;

A bill entitled, a further supplement to an Act entitled, an Act to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county, and for other purposes;

A bill entitled, an Act to repeal the 81st section of Article 7 of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to the Sheriff of Carroll county, as amended by chapter 351, passed January session 1864, and to re-enact the same with amendments;

A bill entitled, an Act to repeal and amend the 81st Article of the Code of Public General Laws relating to Revenue and Taxes;
