

MONDAY, January 23d, 1865.

The President laid before the Senate a communication from the Baltimore Turnpike company ;

Which was referred to the committee on Internal Improvements.

Mr. Carroll presented the petition of Ann Phelps asking relief therein named ;

Which was referred to the committee on Finance.

Mr. Maclin presented sundry petitions from citizens of Howard county ;

Which were referred to the committee on Finance.

On motion of Mr. Carroll,

Leave was granted the committee on Corporations, to report a bill to incorporate the Union Orphan Asylum of Baltimore.

Mr. Maund from the committee on Judicial Proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, an Act to add an Article to the General Law relating to the publication of Laws ;

Reported it without amendment, and

It was read the second time, and ordered to be printed.

The bill entitled, an Act to alter and change the name of Charles Sands to that of Carlos Sales ;

Was read the third time and passed by yeas and nays, as follow :
