6th. The officers of registration shall register all persons as hereinbefore provided, and enter in the proper columns in the books provided for in the preceding section of this Act. 1st. The name of the person so registered. 2d. Whether or not he has been sworn. 3d. His age. 4th. His place of birth. 5th. The time he has resided in the ward or county in which he is registered. 6th. Whether a naturalized or a native born citizen. 7th. If disqualified, the cause of disqualification. 8th. The names of qualified voters, omitting from the last column the names of disqualified persons, and inserting in lieu thereof the names of the witnesses by whom the disqualification was proved on oath as herein provided, if the disqualifying cause arises under the provisions of the fourth section of the first Article of the Constitution.

7th. Every person who may deem himself aggrieved by the decision of the said officers of registration, in refusing to place his name in the column of qualified voters, shall have the right to appeal from such decision to a board of appeal, to be appointed in the following manner: From the list of persons who shall be registered as qualified voters, in the manner herein provided, the said officers of registration shall, in every case of appeal, select by ballot, in the presence of the person refused the right of registration as aforesaid, the names of twenty persons drawn from the whole number of registered voters, from which list of twenty names, the person refused the right of registration as aforesaid, shall strike the names of four persons, and the said officers of registration, or a majority of them shall also strike the names of four persons, and the names of the remaining twelve persons shall constitute a board of appeal as aforesaid, the members whereof having first severally taken an oath, to try said appeal without partiality or prejudice, to the best of their ability, shall, before any election hereafter to be held, hear and determine de novo, said appeal; and in case a majority of the said board shall be of opinion that the party so appealing is a qualified voter, as hereinbefore provided, shall, and so certify to the said officers of registration, and they shall forthwith place the name of said party in the aforesaid column of qualified voters.

8th. Every registration officer who shall knowingly and wilfully refuse to register and record as a qualified voter, any person applying for registration, who is so as aforesaid qualified, and not so as aforesaid proven to be disqualified, shall be liable in damages at the suit of the party so aggrieved, and shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on convicthereof be fined in a sum not less than one hundred nor more than five hundred dollars, or at the discretion of the court be imprisoned in the jail of the county or city where the conviction may be had, for not less than three nor more than nine months.
